

# September Full Opening Information Poster

As school attendance will become mandatory again from the beginning of the Autumn term, Thurton CofE Primary School has considered the measures and system of controls in the Government Publication: 'Guidance for full opening: schools' (published July 2020) when undertaking our coronavirus (COVID-19) risk assessment. Whilst we recognise that we cannot completely eliminate the risk of coronavirus (COVID-19) on site, we have put in place measures required to reduce the risks so far as reasonably practicable.

**System of controls**

This is the set of actions schools must take. They are grouped into 'prevention' and 'response to any infection'.


**Prevention:**

- 1) minimise contact with individuals who are unwell by ensuring that those who have coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms, or who have someone in their household who does, do not attend school
- 2) clean hands thoroughly more often than usual
- 3) ensure good respiratory hygiene by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach
- 4) introduce enhanced cleaning, including cleaning frequently touched surfaces often, using standard products such as detergents and bleach

The school has put the above system of controls in place during the summer term.

5) minimise contact between individuals and maintain social distancing wherever possible

We will be grouping our children into bubbles in the following way:



The children will be kept in their class groups for the majority of the time where possible.

The DfE recognise that it is acceptable for children not to distance within their groups. However, we will support children to maintain distance and not to touch staff or their peers where possible.

Children will sit side by side and facing forwards when working or sitting at a desk. Desks will remain spaced apart as far as possible.

Children will mix into their wider Key Stage groups at times to enable us to deliver a broad and balanced curriculum. For example, for specialist teaching such as phonics and for after school clubs. These wider Key Stage groups will be kept apart where possible.

We advise that pupils continue to limit the amount of equipment they bring into school: we suggest a bag, PE kit, lunch box, hat, coat, books and stationery. Children will be allowed to take books home which will enable our home reading challenge to resume.

All teachers and other staff are able to operate across different classes and Key Stages to facilitate the delivery of our curriculum. For example, Mrs Pyburn will be able to teach languages, e.g. German, to both Green Class and Blue Class. Staff will try to keep their distance from pupils and other staff as much as they can.

As we must avoid large gatherings of pupils, we will be unable to organise whole school collective worship and celebration assemblies until further notice.

To keep groups apart we will be staggering break times and lunchtimes. See below for our lunchtime timetable:

Our meal providers Vertas will recommence hot dinners with a limited menu from September. These will be issued to the children from our servery in disposable containers until further notice.

We will continue to stagger start and finish times at school to keep groups apart and reduce parent gatherings (see the table below). These times will not reduce the amount of overall teaching time.

The one way system will remain in place and parents will still be prohibited from entering the school building without an appointment until further notice.

We will be able to provide Before School Care (7:45am-8:30am) to both KS1 and KS2 children from September. However, we will only be able to provide limited After School Care (3:30am-4:30pm) initially to KS1 children only.

We will be able to provide you with further information regarding after school provision for KS2 children, which will be in the form of an after school club, as soon as our service providers (CSF and Premier Sports) have confirmed that they are recommencing.

*Please contact the school office as soon as possible if you think you will be affected by this.*

Peripatetic teachers, such as music tutors, will be able to recommence their activities in school. More information regarding this will follow in September.

6) where necessary, wear appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE)

We do have PPE onsite but it will only be used if a member of staff is supporting a child with COVID-19 symptoms or delivering intimate care.
